

# Practice Sheet 1.1. – Syriac Alphabet Tracing Sheet (Estrangela)

(Last Updated: February 22, 2021)

Trace the letters of the alphabet using the indicated order to create each letter. Note that several letters include the forms they take when independent, attached to the left, and attached to the right.

## Syriac Alphabet

The tracing sheet consists of 15 rows. Each row features a series of the letter to be traced, followed by a larger version with blue arrows and numbers indicating the stroke order. Row 1: Letter K, 14 instances, then a larger one with stroke 1 (right to left) and stroke 2 (top to bottom). Row 2: Letter G, 14 instances, then a larger one with stroke 1 (top to bottom) and stroke 2 (top to bottom). Row 3: Letter V, 14 instances, then a larger one with stroke 1 (top to bottom) and stroke 2 (top to bottom). Row 4: Letter N, 14 instances, then a larger one with stroke 1 (top to bottom), stroke 2 (top to bottom), and stroke 3 (top to bottom). Row 7: Letter I, 14 instances, then a larger one with stroke 1 (right to left). Row 8: Letter W, 14 instances, then a larger one with stroke 1 (top to bottom) and stroke 2 (top to bottom). Row 9: Letter L, 14 instances, then a larger one with stroke 1 (top to bottom) and stroke 2 (top to bottom). Row 10: Letter R, 14 instances, then a larger one with stroke 1 (top to bottom), stroke 2 (top to bottom), and stroke 3 (top to bottom). Row 11: Letter C, 14 instances, then a larger one with stroke 1 (top to bottom), stroke 2 (top to bottom), and stroke 3 (top to bottom). Row 12: Letter S, 14 instances, then a larger one with stroke 1 (top to bottom) and stroke 2 (top to bottom). Row 13: Letter T, 14 instances, then a larger one with stroke 1 (top to bottom) and stroke 2 (top to bottom). Row 14: Letter H, 14 instances, then a larger one with stroke 1 (top to bottom) and stroke 2 (top to bottom). Row 15: Letter X, 14 instances, then a larger one with stroke 1 (top to bottom), stroke 2 (top to bottom), stroke 3 (top to bottom), and stroke 4 (top to bottom).
